I'd be lying if I didn't say that my study abroad trip to Florence, Italy was single handedly the most life changing experiences I've had as an artist. When applying for SACI I enrolled in Black and White Film Photography. I had never used a film camera before, but having a passion for photography I knew I would enjoy the course, little did I know that this course would change life. The moment I stepped into the darkroom, I knew it would be hard for me to leave. Each day off I would spend experimenting with my 35mm camera. No matter how far I ventured off the day before there were always hundreds of adventures waiting the next day. Yet there was one place that kept calling me. In the pitch black room solely lit with the glow of red safety lights and the dead silence that was running water baths I spent my time alone printing photo after photo. As my pandora station put me at ease in the darkness I experimented with film stacking and cutting, essentially becoming a manual photoshop program.
